Don't Forget: Continuing Education Is Coming!

In our May 2002 newsletter, we outlined the continuing education requirements for license renewal in June 2003. At the risk of being repetitious, here is ANOTHER brief article on continuing education in South Carolina!

A few quick reminders:

- You need 12 hours of CE (at least eight hours must be in health, safety and welfare) for renewal.
- Only those architects chosen at random for audit will be asked to send in proof of compliance.
- If you first became licensed in South Carolina after July 1, 2002, you are exempt from obtaining continuing education for 2003; however, you will be required to meet the requirements thereafter.
- AIA-sponsored events are accepted; NCARB monographs are accepted (with a passing grade on the test).

For more information or for the full text of the regulations, you may access our newsletter or the actual regulations on our Web site.

We have received several questions about continuing education since our last newsletter. We are including the questions and answers here to assist you:

- 1) What if I attend a seminar or workshop and no certificate of attendance is given to participants?

The best thing to do in this situation is keep documentation that could prove you attended: the agenda, handouts, promotional material or notes taken during the workshop. Ask if the presenter/sponsor is keeping a sign-in log; get information on how to get a copy if you need it.

- 2) How can I get information about CE events being held in South Carolina?

The answer applies to all states: You may contact the AIA state chapter. If you are not a member, you may access lists of events on sponsors' Web sites. Don't overlook state agencies that may sponsor relevant events such as the State Energy Office or the State Department of Education's Office of School Facilities or similar agencies. Also, SBCCI and other code groups sponsors workshops on current codes.

- 3) Will reading magazine articles count towards continuing education hours?

Indoor Environment: NCARB Monograph Revised and Updated

Indoor Environment, the second title in NCARB's Professional Development Program monograph series, has been reissued with newly revised and updated information.


The monograph, written and revised by Ronald B. Gobbell, FAIA, Steve M. Hays, PE, CIH, Peter D. Cappel and Phyllis Gobbell, explores the many complex elements and properties that characterize human habitation. As the authors note, "A healthful environment promotes the comfort, health and sense of well-being of all who live, work or play within it." Unhealthy indoor environments not only lead to significant and wide-ranging health effects; they also can have serious economic impacts.

Architects are encouraged to recognize their substantial role in alleviating many of the concerns that typify poor indoor environment. While designing a building, an architect can control the selection of material as well as devise pathways through which contaminants may be exhausted.

The newly updated *Indoor Environment* sells for \$124 (current NCARB Record holders) and \$195 (non-NCARB Record holders). Those successfully completing the *Indoor Environment Quiz* will earn 10 professional development units and 10 AIA learning units in health, safety and welfare. All monograph quizzes may now be taken online through the NCARB Web site. This added convenience eliminates processing time and provides test takers with immediate results.

The NCARB Professional Development Program monograph series was created in 1993 to address the increasing need for continuing education and professional development verification. The revised and updated *Indoor Environment* joins the following titles currently available: *Cracking the Codes*, *Low-Slope Roofing II*, the revised and updated *Energy-Conscious Architecture*, *Why Buildings Fail*, *Sustainable Design*, *Professional Conduct*, *Low-*

Disciplinary Actions

John A Marasco, Registered Architect, Telluride, Colo., entered into a Consent Order in connection with statements on his license renewal form for 2000-2001. Marasco failed to report a sanction by another state's architecture board for the unregistered practice of engineering. Sanctions imposed by the S.C. Board were a Public Reprimand and quarterly reports of all projects undertaken in this state.

Robert W. Ham, Registered Architect, Wilkesboro, N.C., entered into a Consent Order with the Board in connection with statements on his license renewal form for 2001-2002. Ham failed to report a sanction by another state's architecture board. Sanctions imposed by the S.C. Board were a Public Reprimand and \$500 fine.

Barry Greenberg, Registered Architect, and **Architectural Design Guild**. Greenberg entered into a Consent Order in connection with services he provided over a period of eight years during which time Greenberg's firm was not licensed in South Carolina. Additionally, Greenberg provided engineering services beyond the scope of architecture. Sanctions imposed by the Board of Architectural Examiners were a Public Reprimand, \$2,000 fine and immediate registration of his firm. Sanctions imposed by the S.C. Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors through a Consent Order were a Public Reprimand and \$1,000 fine.

Kaplan McLaughlin Diaz (KMD), Charlotte, N.C. The firm entered into a

Consent Order with the Board in connection with services provided for master planning for a large hospital during a period of time when the firm was not registered in South Carolina. Sanctions imposed were a Public Reprimand, \$1,250 fine, and immediate registration of the firm. The firm is now registered.

David J. Hill, Registered Architect, Moultrie, Ga, entered into a Consent Order with the Board for practice beyond the scope of architecture in that he provided engineering services on a project in South Carolina. Sanctions imposed were a Public Reprimand and a \$2,500 fine; the Board also issued a Cease and Desist Order from the practice of engineering.

E. Randolph Knauer, Registered Architect, and his firm, **Richard R. Jencen Associates** were issued an Order to Cease and Desist from the practice of architecture while the firm was unregistered in the state of South Carolina.

Walter Hill, Jr., an unregistered individual, was issued a Cease and Desist Order for his involvement in the design of an apartment complex in Gaffney.

Four Letters of Caution were issued to South Carolina registrants for violations that occurred in other jurisdictions.

Two Letters of Caution were issued to South Carolina registrants for unregistered firm issues.

Update On Legislation

In May 2002, the South Carolina Legislature approved the Emeritus Architect bill proposed by this Board, and in September, Governor Jim Hodges signed the bill into law.

How does this affect you? The bill provides for licensure of emeritus architects and exempts them from the requirements of completing continuing education for renewal. To become an emeritus architect, you must be at least 65 years old, you must have been licensed as an architect for 10 consecutive years, and you must be retired from active practice as an architect. If you meet all of the criteria, you may be licensed as an emeritus architect.

The legislation also:

- Creates an Architecture Education and Research Fund out of a portion of annual renewal fees (no *increase* in fees). The fund is to be used for advancement of education and research for the benefit of individuals and firms licensed in South Carolina, and for interns; for analysis and evaluation of factors, which affect the architecture profession in South Carolina; and for dissemination of the results of the research. To ensure accountability, the Board is



required to report annually to two legislative committees on how the money is spent.

- Allows an architecture degree accredited by the Canadian Architecture

Certification Board for exam candidates. Interns applying to the Board to become licensed by taking the examination must hold a degree accredited by *either* the NAAB or the CACB. Such degrees satisfy the education requirements of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards.

We congratulate those of

you who have reached retirement age and who have earned the title “Emeritus.” We honor your contributions to the profession, your years of service and dedication, and your desire—as expressed by many of you to the Board during this past year—to retain the title of “architect,” which you worked so hard to earn.

If you qualify for emeritus licensure, please contact us for specific requirements and more details. Also, watch our Web site for information.

Rosters Available On Diskette

The roster of licensed architects and architectural firms is available on diskette in comma delimited, tab delimited or database file formats. The cost is \$5 for a listing of the architects or firms or \$10 for both listings. All requests must be in writing, please be sure to specify format and listing when ordering. Check should be made payable to "LLR – Architectural Board."

Please note that section 30-2-50 of the 1976 Code of Laws of South Carolina, as amended, provides that no person or private entity shall knowingly obtain or use any personal information obtained from a public body for any commercial solicitation directed to a person in this state. The South Carolina Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation, as a public entity, gives notice to you, as a requestor of records from this agency, that obtaining or using these public records for commercial solicitation is prohibited. Any person who knowingly uses public records for commercial solicitation is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, must be fined an amount not to exceed \$500 or imprisoned for a term not to exceed one year, or both.

Magazine articles related to architecture and containing a graded test will count if they are "presented" by a group or individual qualified by professional, practical or academic experience. No credit may be claimed for reading magazine articles (or the like) that do not include a test.

- 4) If the Board does not pre-approve a course or workshop, how do I know the workshop I attend will be accepted for renewal of my license?

If the activity is presented by individuals or groups qualified by professional, practical or academic experience, it will be counted. Health, safety and welfare hours will be credited for "the study of relevant technical and professional architectural

subjects related to safeguarding life, health, property and promoting the public welfare." [Reg. 11-8.1(C)]

- 5) We are an architectural firm, and we sometimes have a speaker come in for "Lunch and Learn" sessions. How do we report that?

Giving out certificates would be easy for such sessions; these should list the name/topic of the session, the date, the length of time, as well as the presenter's name and the participant's name.


Slope Roofing I, Seismic Mitigation, Subsurface Conditions, Wind Forces and Fire Safety in Buildings.

Licensing Of Architectural Firms

Unregistered firms continue to be a problem. If you practice in South Carolina as a firm, you must register the firm with this Board. While this form of licensure varies from state to state, and the procedures for licensing the firm vary, it is the LAW in South Carolina.

We make every effort to alert newly registered architects to this state requirement. Immediately upon receiving a reciprocity application, we notify the applicant of the law requiring firms to be licensed, and we send an application packet. When we mail the new license to the architect, we repeat the requirement.

Example: Architect Jim Smith is individually registered in South Carolina. His firm, Smith and Jones Associates/ Architects, is not registered. If the firm provides architectural services in South Carolina through Jim Smith, the firm must be registered with the Board of Architectural Examiners.
