Continuing Education a Must in 2003

Beginning in June 2003, you will need to verify that you have completed 12 hours of continuing education in order to renew your South Carolina license until June 30, 2004. No continuing education is required for renewals this year, in June 2002.

In our October 2001 newsletter, we outlined the requirements and printed the entire text of the regulation. Here again is a synopsis:

- All 12 hours of continuing education must be in structured course study (see below).
- Eight hours must be in topics related to health, safety and welfare; four hours may be in practice-related topics.
- Twelve hours of carry-over will be allowed for a maximum of one year.
- Exemptions will be given for first-time registrants, civilians serving on active duty in the military for 90 consecutive days or more, non-resident architects who must obtain comparable CE in another jurisdiction, and hardship cases.
- The first report of CE obtained will be on renewal forms due by June 30, 2003.
- Noncompliance is considered a violation of the Architect Registration law.

"Structured course study" means education activities presented by individuals or groups qualified by professional, practical, or academic experience to conduct courses of study. The Board has designated the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards and the American Institute of Architects as two such groups, but the Board will not pre-approve courses or workshops. However, if credit is disallowed, you will have 180 calendar days to substantiate the original claim or earn other continuing education credit which fulfills the requirements.



If you are NOT a resident of South Carolina and are required to obtain CE hours for license renewal by the licensing authority of any state in which you are registered, you do not have to complete additional CE hours to renew your South

Carolina license.

Quick Facts:

- Licenses are renewed annually on June 30.
- First report of CE is due in 2003.
- Architects whose first license in South Carolina is issued between July 1, 2002, and June 30, 2003, (whether by exam or by reciprocity) are exempt from reporting CE hours until the next renewal in 2004. All first-time registrants are exempt from CE for the first year of licensure.



Those who are not aware of the ease and economy associated with NCARB monographs complain about traveling to a faraway city where they have to pay for hotel, food and mileage while being nonproductive and out of the office.

(The exception to this is Cracking the Codes, NCARB's newest monograph, which offers a two-part quiz. Each quiz is worth eight PDUs/LUs.) All you have to do is read the monograph at the office, on the train, at home or on a plane—whenever and wherever it's most convenient for you.

When you are finished, simply complete the open-book, on-line quiz, and when you pass, you will have earned PDUs/LUs in health, safety and welfare toward your registration board's continuing education requirement. The price includes the monograph, its quiz and the scoring process. (You even receive one free retest should you fail the first time.) NCARB also reports passing

Disciplinary Actions

Gus J. Roberts, Registered Architect, Columbia, SC, entered into a Consent Order with the Board in connection with his involvement in a day care project in Clarendon County, SC. In the Order, Roberts admitted that design drawings he sealed, which were reviewed by the Office of the State Fire Marshal, were incomplete, referred to incorrect editions of the building code, did not meet minimum building code compliance, and reflected a general lack of understanding of how the various components of the project were to be integrated into a safe and habitable structure. Sanctions imposed were a Public Reprimand, \$1,000 fine, and a requirement to attend and complete an eight-hour course on the International Building Code within six months from the date of the Order.

William C. Malpass, Jr., Registered Architect, Dallas, GA, and Rick Allen Jack, Registered Architect, Whitesburg, GA, entered into a Consent Order with the Board in connection with their involvement in an automobile parts store project in Travelers Rest, SC. At the time the professional services for the project were rendered, neither Jack nor his firm, RJD Architects, were registered to practice in South Caro-

lina. Sanctions imposed were a Public Reprimand, \$500 fine; **Jack and RJD Architects** are now registered to practice in South Carolina.

David H. Sklar, unregistered individual, Hilton Head, SC, was issued a Cease and Desist Order for conveying the impression that he is a South Carolina registered architect in connection with his involvement in a proposed residence to be constructed in Hilton Head, SC.

Keith D. Grice, unregistered individual, West Columbia, SC, and his company, **The Drawing Board, Inc.**, were issued a Cease and Desist Order in connection with his involvement in the design of an apartment complex in West Columbia, SC.

A North Carolina architectural firm, now registered to practice in South Carolina, entered into a **Private Agreement** with the Board, based upon improper sealing of design documents offered for permit.

Five Letters of Caution were issued to South Carolina registrants for violations that occurred in other jurisdictions.

Comments Wanted: Soliciting Work Prior To Licensure

The Board of Architectural Examiners is considering adoption of the following statement as guidance for architects and firms in the practice of architecture under the South Carolina Architectural Practice Act. The purpose of this proposed Statement of Guidance is to clarify the issue of out-ofstate architects soliciting business, making resentations to selections committees, or entering design competitions in South Carolina prior to becoming licensed.

For disciplinary purposes in matters before the Board regarding unregistered practice, compliance with this statement will not be considered a violation of the professional licensing law under Section 40-1-110.

The Board has held the

position over many years that an architect who is licensed in another jurisdiction (state or U.S. territory) and who holds a current Certificate from the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards may seek architectural work in South Carolina prior to licensure, provided that, upon being awarded the commission, he or she immediately applies for and obtains a South Carolina license prior to providing architectural services here.

The Board would appreciate receiving your comments by June 30, 2002, regarding the proposed Statement of Guidance.

Renewals Due June 30

Individual Certificates of Registration expire on JUNE 30, 2002. Renewal notices were mailed on May 7, 2002. If you do not receive a renewal notice by June 1, please contact us. We no longer send reminder notices of renewals.

To avoid a late fee and to keep your name out of the Enforcement Report of this newsletter, please read carefully and answer truthfully the questions asked on the renewal form, sign it, and return it to us by July 1. You are the only person responsible for your answers to these questions. If false or misleading information is provided, the Board will hold you responsible-not your secretary, your assistant, or your office manager.

Reporting of continuing education hours will start with NEXT YEAR'S renewal (June 2003). See the article in this newsletter for details.

Proposed Statement Of Guidance

Solicitation, Presentation or Proposal by Qualified Architect Without A South Carolina License

Individuals

It is the position of the South Carolina Board of Architectural Examiners that individuals wishing to make solicitations, presentations or proposals to provide architectural services in this state may do so without previously obtaining a license in this state, provided the individual who will engage in the practice of architecture in this state:

- 1. holds a current, active and unrestricted license for the practice of architecture from another state or territory, and
- 2. holds a current certificate of qualification issued by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB), and
- 3. applies for a South Carolina license immediately upon being awarded a commission to provide architectural services in this state, and
- 4. obtains a South Carolina license prior to providing architectural services in this state pursuant to the commission.

irms?

Section 40-3-270 of the 1976 Code of Laws of South Carolina, as amended, places certain requirements on firms desiring to practice or offer to practice architecture in this state. Accordingly, it should be remembered that, upon being awarded a commission to provide architectural services in this state, any firm involved in the commission should immediately apply for a Certificate of Authorization (firm license). Prior to providing architectural services in this state pursuant to the commission, any firm involved in the commission must obtain a Certificate of Authorization (firm license).

Individuals and Firms

Although an architect or firm that conducts itself in accordance with this policy may not be disciplined by the Board of Architectural Examiners for unlicensed or unregistered practice, an architect or firm may still face disciplinary action by the Board in other matters and may still face civil liability under some circumstances and, therefore, should consult private counsel where doubt exists as to what actions are appropriate.

Frequently Asked CE Questions

Q: When is the first report due?

A: The first reporting of CE to the South Carolina Board is due with the renewal form no later than June 30, 2003.

Q: How will I file? Is there a special form?

A: The renewal form will contain a section regarding continuing education. No other special form is needed.

Q: What documentation do I need?

A: If you are selected for audit, we will ask that you submit documentation of attendance at events for which you claim credit. "Proof" of attendance may be a certificate of attendance issued by the sponsoring organization, an AIA/CES transcript, a letter verifying your attendance from the sponsor, or similar verifiable documentation.

Q: Can I send in information on CE events I've attended all during the year?

A: You will need to send in documentation

ONLY if you are selected for a random audit. You do not have to submit proof of attendance unless you are requested to do so.

Q: What if I'm not a member of the AIA?

A: Non-AIA members may attend CE events sponsored by the AIA by paying the non-member fee. For information on events sponsored by the South Carolina AIA, access their web site at www.aiasc.org.

There are many opportunities to obtain continuing education credits from national organizations, local businesses, and from publications that include a test of knowledge gained. NCARB monographs are an excellent way to obtain 10-14 hours with successful completion of the test (either online or by paper).

Q: When may I start obtaining CE? A: After July 1, 2001.

Q: How do I know what classes/events the Board will accept?

A: The Board will not pre-approve continuing education events. If an event is spon-

sored by the AIA or an AIA-approved sponsor, it will be accepted. If the activity meets the criteria established in the law and regulations, the Board will accept it.

Q: Will the Board publicize CE events sponsored by other organizations (on a Web site)?

A: No.

Q: If I accrue more than the required 12 continuing education hours in one year, may I carry them over to the next reporting period?

A: Yes, the regulations allow a maximum carryover of 12 hours for one year only.

Q: May I get CE for attending a trade show?

A: No. Mere attendance at a trade show will not be acceptable CE. However, if you attend an educational event during the trade show that meets the criteria, and if your attendance can be verified, you may count that time toward continuing education.

scores to the AIA at no additional cost.

The remaining two contact hours can be easily accomplished by reading one of the many articles in magazines such as Architecture, after which you answer a few true/false questions or fill-in-the-blank questions, and then transmit for verification.

Don't misunderstand. Conventions, seminars and conferences are important, instructive and exciting, but do not feel obligated to attend because you have to complete your continuing education requirements. I personally like to do both monographs and conventions; each is important to our profession and the sharing of current ideas that keeps the design community responsible and informed.

Remember that CE requirements vary from jurisdiction to jurisdiction. It is important that you stay abreast of your registration board's current requirements for licensure renewal. If you have any questions about continuing education, contact your board directly.

- * Each of the following titles equals 10 PDUs/10 AIA LUs in health, safety and welfare: Why Buildings Fail, Sustainable Design, Professional Conduct, Low-Slope Roofing I, Seismic Mitigation, Subsurface Conditions, Fire Safety in Buildings, and the updated Energy-Conscious Architecture. Each monograph costs \$125 for current NCARB Certificate holders and \$195 for non-Certificate holders.
- * Each of the following titles equals 14 PDUs/14 AIA LUs in health, safety and welfare: Low-Slope Roofing II and Wind Forces. Each monograph costs \$175 for current NCARB Certificate holders and \$245 for non-Certificateholders.
- * Cracking the Codes has two quizzes, and the successful completion of each equals eight PDUs/eight AIA LUs in health, safety and welfare. The complete set monograph and two quizzes costs \$200 for current NCARB Certificate holders and \$270 for non-Certificate holders. The monograph and one quiz costs \$125 for current NCARB Certificate holders and \$195 for non-Certificate holders and \$195 for non-Certificate holders. The second quiz may then be purchased for \$75 by current Certificate holders and non-Certificate holders.

Notice To South Carolina Examination Candidates

Many of you are aware of the "rolling window" which affects credit retention of the A.R.E. divisions you have passed.

You have four years from the date the rolling window provision was implemented to pass all divisions of the examination. Credit for each division passed is retained for four years after which time you musttake the section(s) again.

You have unlimited opportunities to retake the examination. Even if you do not sit for an exam, the "clock" is still ticking. If you have any questions about your examination status, please submit a written request for clarification as to how you will be affected.
