

NOTICE TO BUILDING DEPARTMENTS

Re: Sign Structures

On October 19, 2023, the Contractor's Licensing Board addressed a request from local building officials to clarify its interpretation of the scope of the exemption for the installation, repair, or maintenance of signs or billboards found at S.C. Code § 40-11-360. The Board confirmed that the exemption covers signs only and that sign structures fall outside of the scope of the exemption. **Thus, while no license is required to install, repair, or maintain a sign, a license is required for the construction of sign structures when construction of the structure includes work falling within a licensure classification and the total cost of the project exceeds the statutory cost threshold.** This interpretation is consistent with the Board's long-held position that a license is required for those portions of a project falling within a license classification, even if a license is not required for other portions of the project. The Board previously addressed this issue in 2016, when it accepted the recommendation of its Sign Study Committee that a specialty license in the concrete or structural framing classifications was required to erect or install a sign. The Board would direct building officials to Appendix H of the South Carolina Building Code for additional information related to sign structures.

While the Board's recent interpretation of S.C. Code § 40-11-360(11) is in keeping with its prior positions concerning the licensing requirements for sign structures, LLR encourages local building departments to consult with their legal counsel to determine the appropriate course of action.
