



Crematory Operator Requirements and Registration Process Overview

Registration Requirements:

An individual is qualified to receive a **Crematory Operator** registration when the following requirements are met:

1. Submit a complete application and pay the application fee to the Board.
2. Successfully complete a Board-approved crematory operator training course and submit the certification of completion to the Board.
3. Provide the Board with an official statewide criminal background check for every state you have resided in within the past 5 years.

Registration Process Overview:

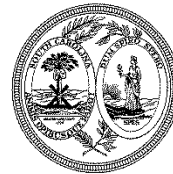
Your application is good for one (1) year from the date of receipt. If all required information is not received within this one (1) year period; you must resubmit the application. This includes, but is not limited to, the application fee, transcripts, license verifications, etc.

1. **Application** – In addition to a completed application, the following must also be sent:
 - **Identification:**
 - Copy of your valid Driver's License, State Issued ID, Passport, or military ID
 - Copy of your Social Security Card
 - **Crematory Operator Training:** A copy of the certificate of completion from a Board-approved crematory operator training course must be submitted with your application. The current Board-approved training courses are:

- **Legal documentation of name change** (marriage certificate, divorce decree, etc.)
 - **Background Check:** An official statewide criminal background check for the state(s) you have resided within the past five (5) years is required. If a conviction (or guilty plea) is reported, the applicant must provide a written explanation on the matter. Applicants with prior criminal convictions and/or guilty pleas will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis and may be required to appear before the Board regarding the background check results.
 - **Personal History Questions:** For any “Yes” answer in the Personal History section, you must provide a [detailed statement of the events](#) surrounding the conviction(s), denial or discipline of licensure, including all pertinent information (such as charges, dates, locations, and sentences). Provide copies of any case, file or licensing documents or records showing the final disposition, if applicable.
2. **Issuance of Registration:** Upon receipt of a complete approved application, the Board office will send notification of registration. A copy of the registration may be printed from the Online Portal at <https://eservice.llr.sc.gov/PocketCard/>. A physical copy of the certificate will be mailed to the mailing address indicated on the application.

VERIFICATION OF LAWFUL PRESENCE IN THE UNITED STATES
AFFIDAVIT OF ELIGIBILITY



Pursuant to Section 8-29-10, *et seq.* of the South Carolina Code of Laws (1976, as amended), the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation must verify that any person who applies for a South Carolina license is lawfully present in the United States. Complete and sign this affidavit of eligibility. The information provided is subject to verification.

Section B: ATTESTATION.

I understand that in accordance with section 8-29-10 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, a person who knowingly and willfully makes a false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation in an affidavit shall, in addition to other sanctions imposed by this State or the United States, be guilty of a felony, and upon conviction must be fined and/or imprisoned for not more than 5 years (or both).

I understand that the representations made in this Affidavit shall apply through any license(s) or renewals issued, and that I shall have an affirmative duty to immediately advise the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation of any change of my immigration or citizenship status.

I swear and attest the information contained herein is true and correct to the best of my knowledge. I understand that under South Carolina law, providing false information is grounds for denial, suspension, or revocation of a license, certificate, registration or permit.

INSTRUCTION SHEET FOR COMPLETING AFFIDAVIT OF ELIGIBILITY

CHECK box 1:

If you are a United States Citizen by birth or naturalization

CHECK box 2:

If you are a Legal Permanent Resident and you are not a U.S. Citizen, but are residing in the U.S. under legally recognized and lawfully recorded permanent residence as an immigrant.

PROVIDE A COPY OF ALL IMMIGRATION DOCUMENTS.

CHECK box 3:

If you are a Qualified Alien. You are a Qualified Alien if you are:

An alien who is lawfully admitted for residence under the INA.

An alien who is granted asylum under Section 208 of the INA.

A refugee who is admitted to the United States under Section 207 of the INA.

An alien who is paroled into the United States under Section 212(d)(5) of the INA for a period of at least 1 year.

An alien whose deportation is being withheld under Section 243(h) of the INA (as in effect prior to April 1, 1997) or whose removal has been withheld under Section 241(b)(3).

An alien who is granted conditional entry pursuant to Section 203(a)(7) of the INA as in effect prior to April 1, 1980.

An alien who is a Cuban/Haitian Entrant as defined by Section 501(e) of the Refugee Education Assistance Act of 1980.

An alien who has been battered or subjected to extreme cruelty, or whose child or parent has been battered or subject to extreme cruelty.
