## TASKS ALL SOUTH CAROLINA-LICENSED PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS ARE QUALIFIED TO PERFORM WITH AN APPROVED SCOPE OF PRACTICE AND SUPERVISING PHYSICIAN

\*The S.C. Board of Medical Examiners has removed lumbar puncture, arthrocentesis, central line placement and endotracheal intubation from the list of tasks that all S.C.-licensed Physician Assistants may perform. In order to perform these tasks, they now must appear in your individual scope of practice approved by the board.

- 1. Local anesthesia
- 2. Pap smears
- 3. Apply splint or cast for stable fractures
- 4. Start IVs
- 5. Flush port-a-cath
- 6. Replace Gastric Tube
- 7. Place Nasogastric Tube
- 8. ACLS/CPR/PALS [if certified]
- 9. Removal of foreign bodies
- 10. Treatment and removal of ingrown toenails
- 11. Coordinate clinical studies
- 12. Suture lacerations
- 13. Irrigation and Drainage of wounds and abscesses
- 14. Wound debridement and management including removal of drains
- 15. Assist in surgery
- 16. Cauterize benign lesions

- 17. Skin biopsy
- 18. Excise simple lesions
- 19. Venipuncture
- 20. Trepanation of subungual hematoma
- 21. Catheterization—urethral
- 22. Manage chest tubes
- 23. Perform History and Physical Assessment
- 24. Administration of COVID vaccines

The approved scope of practice should be reviewed annually by the supervising physician and the physician assistant. The supervising physician and his or her physician assistant may request approval of additional tasks with documentation of competency.

Documentation should consist of:

- Number of times procedure performed
- · Documentation from prior employer as to competency level
- · Documentation of prior training
