NEUROLOGY SCOPE OF PRACTICE GUIDELINES

Medical conditions for which treatment may be initiated, continued or modified, include, but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Headaches & facial pain
- 2. Dizziness/Vertigo
- 3. Post concussive syndrome
- 4. Cerebrovascular disease
- 5. Aphasia
- 6. Multiple Sclerosis
- 7. Dementia
- 8. Epilepsy
- 9. Neuromuscular disease
- 10. Nerve Palsies
- 11. Neuropathy
- 12. Tremor and other movement disorders
- 13. All other conditions deemed appropriate by supervising physician.
- 14. Other co-existing conditions and responses to surgical/medical treatment which will necessitate intervention.

Other non-neurological disorders that PA may encounter and initiate evaluations include:

Psychiatric Disorders: (May identify, initiate work-up and Initiate care on referral) Depression & Anxiety

Diabetes mellitus and hypoglycemia: (May Identify, initiate work-up and initiate care on referral)

Diabetes mellitus

Hypoglycemic states

Lipid abnormalities

Lipid fractions and the risk of coronary heart disease

Therapeutic effects of lowering cholesterol for heart disease and bone mineral density

General Problems in Infectious Diseases: (May identify, initiate work-up and initiate care on referral)

Fever of unknown origin (FUO)

Animal and human bite wounds

Sexually transmitted diseases

Joint disorders as they relate to infectious diseases

Disorders Due to Physical Agents: (May identify, initiate work-up and initiate care on referral)

Disorders due to cold

Disorders due to heat

Poisoning: (May identify, initiate work-up and initiate care on referral)

General Approach to the Patient: (May identify, initiate work-up and initiate care on referral)

Health maintenance and disease prevention

Substance abuse

Common symptoms

Pain Fever and hypothermia Weight loss Fatigue

Geriatric Medicine: (May identify, Initiate work-up and initiate care on referral) General principles of geriatric medicine Evaluation of the elderly

Cancer: Upon diagnosis- all cancer patients are to be discussed with MD and appropriate referral made (May identify, initiate work-up and initiate care on referral)

Incidence and etiology Prevention of cancer

Additional skills may include:

- Lumbar tap
- Insertion of lumbar drain
- Interrogation and/or programming of neurostimulators and baclofen pumps
