## **ADVISORY OPINION # 11**

**QUESTION:** What is the appropriate policy and procedure for the management of physicians' telephone orders received by health care agencies from physicians' office personnel?

The Board of Nursing for South Carolina acknowledges that under the direction of the prescribing physician, the RN or LPN is the most appropriate person in a physician's office to communicate orders to licensed nursing personnel in the health care agency where the patient is receiving care.

The Board of Nursing for South Carolina acknowledges that the best interests of all members of the health care team are served by having the physician/APRN/PA write or document all orders in the patient's electronic medical record. Nevertheless, verbal, telephone, and faxed orders still exist and must be handled by established applicable policies and procedures.

This statement is an advisory opinion of the Board of Nursing as to what constitutes competent and safe nursing practice.
