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QUESTION: Is it within the role and scope of responsibilities of unlicensed assistive personnel to perform digital intervention for the treatment of fecal impaction?

The State Board of Nursing for South Carolina acknowledges that digital intervention for the treatment of fecal impaction is **NOT** within the role and scope of responsibilities of unlicensed assistive personnel. However, it is within the role and scope of responsibilities of licensed nurses and should **NOT** be delegated to unlicensed assistive personnel.

A fecal impaction is caused by unrelieved constipation and is considered a medical problem diagnosed by a Licensed Independent Practitioner (LIP) performing a physical exam based on patient symptoms. Digital intervention used to remove the stool is often done by the LIP or nurse when other methods of facilitating a bowel movement are not effective.

This digital intervention process is not to be confused with digital stimulation used in patients experiencing spinal cord injury and have specific bowel management plans implemented on a regular basis. In these situations, trained unlicensed assistive personnel may perform this function when delegated by a licensed nurse.

This statement is an advisory opinion of the Board of Nursing as to what constitutes competent and safe nursing practice.
